Project Update

The Greenwich Hospital Redevelopment project is set to deliver a purpose-built health and aged care precinct designed to meet the needs of the local community now and into the future. While early works are progressing smoothly on site, we want to keep you informed about the changes happening in and around the hospital as the project moves forward.

As part of ongoing works, we'd like to let you know that the footpath along River Road, adjacent to the hospital boundary, will be temporarily closed for approximately six weeks. These works support essential infrastructure upgrades and form part of the State Significant Development consent and Lane Cove Council requirements.

What's happening

From late-April, HammondCare will carry out:

- Upgrading of the existing footpath
- Substation footing, retaining wall, and excavation works

What this means for you

The footpath along River Road will be closed near the hospital. A pedestrian diversion will be in place, redirecting foot traffic safely through the hospital grounds.

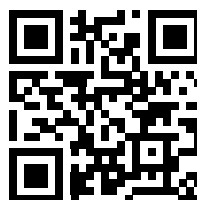
The diversion will be clearly marked, with ticketed traffic controllers onsite at peak periods to support pedestrian safety at crossing points.
